The Director of Programs and Services will uphold IQ principles and the mission and vision of the Manitoba Inuit Association. This individual will possess strong Inuit knowledge and lived life experience in the challenges faced by Urban and rural/remote-living Inuit in Manitoba.

Specific Responsibilities / Accountabilities

The Director of Programs & Services is responsible and accountable for:

- Provide leadership and direction in the planning/developing, implementing, maintaining, and evaluating of Inuit community programs and services, incorporating input from CEO, Community, and other key stakeholders.
