The Role

We are seeking a Policy & Program Analyst to join our team. Reporting to the Director of Policy & Housing, this role will support policy and development across the organization. This position plays an important role in strengthening IAM's programs and ensuring Inuit families and communities in Manitoba are well supported.

Key Responsibilities

- Develop and lead policy & program work in all areas of the organization.
- Develop operational guidelines for the Inuit Women and Children's Safe Shelter, Transtional Housing, and Day Care, as well as overall organizational policies.
- Research, develop and write funding proposals to support program and services.
- Prepare clear recommendations and reports for leadership, government and community partners.
- Review, research, and update all internal policies & programs.
- Perform other duties as assigned by leadership.

Qualifications

Inuk preferred;

- University degree in political science, public administration, social sciences, or related field (graduate degree preferred).
- 3–5 years of experience in public policy analysis and development.
- Knowledge of Canadian charities and nonprofits, particularly Inuit communities and culture, is an asset.
- Strong research, writing, and analytical skills, with the ability to prepare compelling reports.
- Proficiency in Microsoft Office and ability to manage multiple priorities.
- Fluency in English required; knowledge of Inuktitut or French considered an asset.
- Ability to travel for meetings, training, and reporting requirements.
